The Laurel Tree Players Presents *Why Do Fools Fall In Love?*

Beehives, boys, and breakups! The 60's return to the stage in a lighthearted and nostalgic musical revue which will leave the audience singing the songs long after they leave. That's the promise of the Laurel Tree Players' production of *Why Do Fools Fall In Love?* by Roger Bean. The Laurel Tree Players has been playing to sold out audiences for 19 years. Her friends include the liberated individualist Sally (Erica Borges), the overwhelmingly shy Florence (Melissa Murphy-Leite) and the overzealous sweet-tooth-suffering Dee-Dee (Tricia Grime). As they share stories about their love lives, and reveal some of their secrets, these women find a new confidence in themselves which blossoms by the end of the story.

Maurice Ouellette, the director, said, "Why Do Fools Fall in Love?" is a celebration of real friendship, the strength it gives us, and its importance, especially during times of struggle. The show delivers this with the rhythms of the 60's.

The show features such hits as "My Boy Lollipop," "He's a Rebel," "Baby I'm Yours," "I Will Follow Him," "Why Do Fools Fall in Love," "Hey There Lonely Boy," "Go'n Out of My Head," "You Don't Have To Say You Love Me," and many others. The long time musical director of the Laurel Tree Players, Teresa Ouellette, will once again be at the podium.
